


The reading levels [RL] listed indicate approximate reading level in school years.

1. Williams, Dar <u>AMALEE</u> (RL: 4.4)

Amalee's world is all out of order. She's used to chaos, because of the frequent presence of her father's bantering, bickering group of fun friends. But when Amalee's dad becomes seriously ill, the chaos takes new forms, and the ways of coping come from some very unexpected places.

2. Giff, Patricia PICTURES OF HOLLIS WOODS (RL: 4.5)

Abandoned at birth, Hollis Woods has always wished for a family. One of her many foster parents described her as "a mountain of trouble." When a retired art teacher takes the 12-year-old into her home, the two bond almost immediately. However, as Josie becomes more forgetful, Hollis must become the caregiver, and in doing so she remembers key events from her own life.

3. Hearne, Betsy <u>WISHES, KISSES, AND PIGS</u> (RL: 4.6)

Louise Tolliver loves Tolliver's Hollow, the "peculiar" place where she lives with her mother and brother. She just wishes that her father hadn't disappeared seven years ago, and that her brother, Willie, didn't tease her so much. Still, when she calls Willie a pig as the evening star appears, she never meant for the wish to come **true**!

4. Peck, Richard A LONG WAY FROM CHICAGO (RL: 4.6)

Set in the 1930s, the book follows Joe and Mary Alice Dowdel as they make their annual August trek to visit their grandmother, who lives in a sleepy Illinois town. A woman with plenty of gusto, Grandma Dowdel uses her wit and ability to tell whoppers to get the best of manipulative people.




5. Paolini, Christopher <u>ERAGON</u> (RL: 7.8)


When Eragon finds a polished blue stone in the forest, he is thrust overnight into a perilous new world of destiny, magic, and power. With only an ancient sword and the advice of an old storyteller, Eragon and his fledgling dragon must navigate the dangerous terrain and dark enemies of an Empire ruled by a king whose evil knows no bounds.

6. Creech, Sharon <u>WALK TWO MOONS</u> (RL: 6.6)

Thirteen-year-old Salamanca Tree Hiddle's mother leaves home suddenly on a spiritual quest, vowing to return, but can't keep her promise. The girl and her father leave their farm in Kentucky and move to Ohio, where Sal meets Phoebe Winterbottom, also 13. While Sal accompanies her eccentric grandparents on a six-day drive to Idaho to retrace her mother's route, she entertains them with the tale of Phoebe, whose mother has also left home.

7. Flake, Sharon MONEY HUNGRY (RL: 5.9)



When her money issues begin interfering with her friendships, Raspberry is forced to reexamine her priorities and values.

8. Swanson, James <u>CHASING LINCOLN'S KILLER</u>

(**RL: 8.3**) "Chasing Lincoln's Killer" is a fast-paced, non-fiction thriller about the pursuit of John Wilkes Booth and his co-conspirators. It recounts


the assassination of the president, as well as the twelve-day chase through the streets of Washington, D.C., the swamps of Maryland, and the forests of Virginia.

9. Alexander, Kwame CROSSOVER (RL: 5.8)



Until the day new student Betty walks into her class and quickly reveals herself to be cruel and manipulative. Her bullying seems isolated at first, but things quickly escalate, and reclusive World War I veteran Toby becomes a target of her attacks. While others have always seen Toby's strangeness, Annabelle knows only kindness. She will soon need to find the courage to stand as a lone voice of justice as tensions mount.

12. Stead, Rebecca GOODBYE, STRANGER (RL: 5.0)





13. Lewis, John <u>MARCH</u> (RL: 6.3)

The first book in this graphic novel (*comic book-style*) series written by US Congressman John Lewis, March is a vivid first-hand account of Lewis' lifelong struggle for civil and human rights, Rooted in Lewis' personal story, it also reflects on the highs and lows of the broader civil rights

movement of the 1960s, when activists sought equal rights for all races.
